

# MATRIX Guide Series Instructions

- Assemble the sight as shown and mount it to your bow with two Flathead cap screws provided. It is recommended that you use the mounting holes closest to the quiver mounting holes. This will place your sight further from your bow and optimize your pin gap.
- Sight in the 20 yard pin first. Use the micro adjustments of the Guide Series Bracket system to adjust the elevation and windage. To use the Guide Series System, loosen one socket cap screw and turn the corresponding Guide Series Knob in the desired direction. Tighten the screw when your desired adjustment is complete.
- Each archer puts a unique torque in their bow based on how they hold it. If at full draw, the pins do not appear to be in a perfect vertical line, you might need to adjust the torque of your sight. To do this, loosen the top and bottom torque adjustment screws (G), swing the sight housing till the pins appear to be in a vertical line, and then tighten the torque screws down securely. If your sight is on at 20 yards but you are shooting consistently to the left or right at further yardages, then you might need to adjust for additional torque in your bow, or check the level of your sight.
- Each of the pins has an individual Micro Adjustment. Unlock the appropriate Cam-Lock, then adjust the corresponding Micro-Tek Gear, located on the opposite side of the Sight housing to customize your vertical pin gap as needed for longer yardages. Once you are finished replace the Cam-Lock into the locked position. This is a patented no tool feature (US Pat. 6,418,633).
- An optional LED light can be purchased from your authorized Trophy Ridge dealer to enhance this sight even further.
- **WARNING:** Make sure you have proper arrow clearance when sighting in any Trophy Ridge product. Don't allow any part of the arrow (fletching, broadhead, shaft) to come into contact with any part of the sight housing to insure that no harm will come to you or your equipment.
